05 MAY 2018 – SHIP ARRIVES IN AUCKLAND: /*Five day port call.

*The ship will leave when port activities are completed and its departure cannot be postponed to accommodate late arrivals.

Science Party - Arrival date into AUCKLAND: No later than – 05 MAY 2018
Board ship on - *06 MAY 2018

Co-Chiefs - Arrival date into AUCKLAND: No later than – 04 MAY 2018
Board ship on – 05 MAY 2018

*All members of the science party are expected to board the ship on the above date. A later arrival date must be cleared with the JOIDES Resolution Science Operator (JRSO) Project Manager, as the ship sails when ready.

05 JULY 2018 – SHIP WILL ARRIVE BACK IN AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

Disembarking staff/science party should not schedule return flights before 0600 on 06 July 2018.

GROUND TRANSPORTATION: Unless instructed otherwise, taxis should be used for transportation between the airport and hotel before and after the expedition. Buses or vans will be used between the hotel and ship as the Port Agent must escort all personnel from the ship to the hotel.

VISAS: New Zealand – Special visa instructions on page 2

IMPORTANT NOTE: Failure to meet each country's visa requirements may prohibit the boarding and disembarking of shipboard personnel and is subject to immigration detention.

PASSPORTS: Passports are required for all participants.

NEW ZEALAND VISA - Citizens of visa waiver countries do not have to apply for a visa before traveling to New Zealand if

- They are visiting for 3 months or less
- They are visiting for 6 months or less and are a British citizen

Although you will not need a visa if you are a citizen of a visa waiver country, you will need a special directive letter. Once the participant list for each expedition is complete, our port agent will work with Immigration New Zealand (IMZ) to obtain the letter, which may take 5-7 business days. These letters will then be distributed to you before your departure and must be carried with you at all times.

If you are not a citizen of one of the countries listed below, you will need to apply for a Visitor Visa (General). Applications should be made for a 3 month duration in New Zealand, although it will allow you to apply for a multiple entry visa good up to 12 months. A special directive letter must be included as an attachment. **DO NOT** apply for this visa until you receive this letter.
